- *There are a handful of classes which ordinarily run longer than the time allocated to them when rescheduled to meet on Friday (For example, there is one section of Negotiations that meets before 11 and would go till the mid-4s on Friday because it is one of the few pre-11 classes that lasts more than 90 minutes...). We don't yet know precisely how we will handle such classes because we don't yet know whether it would cause students to face conflicts if the rescheduled class "ran over." Broadly speaking, we assume that the instructor in such classes will have to (a) determine whether anyone in his or her class would have a conflict if the class met past 3:05, giving them time to get to 3:15 class...) and then show one of a number of forms of flexibility (e.g. if it's just one student, maybe run the class as is and let that one student out of the last part of class; if it's a number of students, arrange to start a bit early and/or have a shorter than typical session. Instructors facing the problem will be alerted to check with students and then work with SLS administrators if they're having trouble coming up with a solution....*
