Amazing things happen in our community every day. In the past few months, Sri Srinivasan, BA '89, JD/MBA '95, began as a D.C. Circuit judge; Michelle Friedland, BS '94, JD '00, and John Owens, JD '96, were nominated to the Ninth Circuit; and the students and faculty in our Supreme Court Litigation Clinic helped win a landmark civil rights case, *United States v. Windsor*.

Financial Overview

Philanthropic support from alumni, parents, and friends provides an essential source of income each year for Stanford Law School. The bar chart below illustrates the financial health of the school and demonstrates the vital importance of charitable gifts to the annual budget.

Sources of Income

Fiscal Year 2013 Total Dollars Raised

This figure includes both outright gifts and multi-year pledges committed during fiscal year 2013. Accordingly, "Total Dollars Raised" (\$22,453,744) will be more than "Gifts and Grants" (\$7,807,295) since the latter only reflects contributions used in fiscal year 2013.

ENDOWMENT PAYOUT

Annual payout of about 5% of the value of funds invested in the university's endowment

■ UNIVERSITY ALLOCATION

Income received from the university that includes tuition, fees and other general funds

■ GIFTS & GRANTS

Generous support from alumni and friends that provides resources for nearly every program opportunity at the school

OTHER INCOME

Includes executive education and conference fees, which offset the cost of running those programs, and fund other strategic school priorities

In fiscal year 2013, support from alumni, parents, and friends constituted 53% of the law school's budget. Your gifts provide necessary resources to make Stanford Law School a leader in legal education.

Funding intellectual and social events, communications, reunions, volunteer programs, and MCLE credit learning opportunities


■ CROWN LAW LIBRARY

Each gift matters and every dollar counts. Your contributions to the Law Fund provide vital support for the school's most critical needs and innovative new initiatives.

Gifts to the Law Fund totaled more than \$4.4 million in Fiscal Year 2013—approximately 6% of the total annual budget and equivalent to the payout on an \$80 million endowment. 86% of the school's donors were contributors to the Law Fund in 2012-2013.
