She has invested broadly in all stages and areas of information technology companies throughout her career. She served as a General Partner in eight IVP funds. Over the course of a 20 year period, she served on the Board of Directors of numerous private and public information technology companies that IVP invested in. She developed an outstanding reputation as a valuable board member for her work helping these companies grow and succeed.

Prior to joining IVP, Ms. Elmore was a marketing manager at Intel Corporation's Development Systems Division. She was part of a small team of professionals across all divisions of Intel that worked closely with the sales force to achieve market leadership of Intel microprocessors.

Currently, Ms. Elmore is an advisor to the IVP funds and a private angel investor with The Broadway Angels an angel investment group made up of world-class investors and business executives who all happen to be women.

She is currently a member of the advisory council of the Stanford Graduate School of Business and the advisory council to Stanford's Center on Longevity. She is on the board of directors for the Children's Health Council, Palo Alto, CA. She has also served as a Director of the Western Association of Venture Capitalists (WAVC), the Duke University Sanford School of Public Policy Board of Visitors, the Purdue University Mathematics Advisory Council, the Stanford Business School Trust, and the board of trustees of Sacred Heart Schools, Atherton, CA.

Ms. Elmore was a member of the inaugural class of Stanford's Distinguished Career Institute and spent full time at Stanford in 2015.
