RE: Response to Correspondence Requesting Clarification of EOIR FOIA Request/ Placing Response on Hold 2022-55750

Dear Ms. Perez Santiago,

I am writing in response to your letter, dated September 27, 2022. In that letter, you indicated that the FOIA request as filed, "would require the Executive Office of Immigration Review to conduct an unreasonably burdensome search." More specifically, the letter stated that "EOIR would have to search over 3,000 email accounts for all EOIR employees and contractors for a time period of approximately 19 months."

While requestor does not concede that the original request was "unreasonably burdensome," it nevertheless narrows the scope of the original request in order to facilitate the prompt production of records.

The requestor modifies the original request and seeks the following records¹ prepared, received, transmitted, collected, and/or maintained by the Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR):

¹ The term "records" as used herein includes all records or communications preserved in electronic or written form, including but not limited to correspondence, documents, data, videotapes, e-mails, faxes, files, guidance, guidelines, evaluations, instructions, analyses, memoranda, agreements, notes, orders, policies, procedures, protocols, reports, rules, manuals, technical specifications, training materials, and studies.

- All records from January 2021 through the present that include the term "Dedicated Docket," that were created by <u>or</u> sent from the following individuals/positions within the Department of Justice- Executive Office of Immigration Review (EOIR):
 - o Director of the Executive Office of Immigration Review
 - o Deputy Director of the Executive Office of Immigration Review
 - o Chairman of the Board of Immigration Appeals
 - o Chief Appellate Immigration Judge of the Board of Immigration Appeals
 - Deputy Chief Appellate Immigration Judge of the Board of Immigration Appeals
 - o Assistant Director, Office of Policy
 - o Chief Immigration Judge
 - Deputy Chief Immigration Judge (including Principal Deputy and Regional Deputies)
 - Assistant Chief Immigration Judges located in the Immigration Courts participating in the Dedicated Docket.²
 - Court Administrators located in the Immigration Courts participating in the Dedicated Docket.³

As was indicated in the original request, Requestor *does not* request the record of proceedings, immigration court files, or other records of individual noncitizens' removal proceedings. Requestor also *does not* request EOIR database records.

The Requestor renews its request for a fee waiver or reduction of all costs as well as expedited processing.

I trust that this limitation and narrowing of senders/recipients will allow the agency to promptly review and release records within 20 days as is statutorily required.
